Dear Parent(s)/Carer(s),

Please find enclosed your child's full subject report for Year 11.

The document outlines your child's EAP (Expected Attainment Pathway) and AT (Aspirational Target) for each of their subjects. These are based on the grades that they achieved in their Key Stage 2 SATs. The document also includes a 'mock grade' which is the grade achieved in the recent mock examination only. It does not take into account any coursework or controlled assessment. The Working at Grade (WAG) is the grade that all of your child's work to-date has been awarded, including the recent mock examination. The prediction is what the teacher for each subject area believes your child is on track to achieve if there is continued improvement and once the course has been completed and any necessary support and intervention has taken place. If your child studies ICT, Sport, Performing Arts or Music, these subjects are graded as pass (P), merit (M) or distinction (D).

The report also includes an 'attitude to learning' grade which is on a scale of 1 to 4. This takes into account the level of effort and commitment applied to an individual's studies in lessons, as well as their completion of homework and wider independent study. A grade of 1 indicates that a student is doing everything that is required of them inside and outside lessons, often going above and beyond expectations. A grade of 4 would indicate that there are serious concerns about the efforts of an individual and that this is having an impact on their progress.

You will shortly be receiving a notice regarding some of our subjects putting on sessions during the Easter break. These are primarily focussed on subjects where further support with controlled assessment and/or project work would be beneficial. There are also sessions in some exam-based subjects where it has not been possible to run after-school sessions consistently. Students will have been given additional information regarding this from teaching staff if attendance would benefit them. All students should also engage with revision activities set via show my homework and guidance on the school website to support their ongoing revision programme over the Easter break.
