In our school we are members of a large community and there are certain personal standards of behaviour which must be observed if we are to ensure that our life in school proceeds smoothly, pleasantly and efficiently. Our School Behaviour Policy* reflects our 3 main rules and personal standards:

Be Ready

Attend school every day possible and arrive on time.

Bring all the basic equipment needed for the day.

Wear the correct uniform in the correct way, every day.

Be punctual for everything.

Be ready to learn and accept new challenges.

Remove coats on entry to the school building.

• Be Respectful

Follow staff instructions first time and at all times.

Behave respectfully to others.

Be considerate to others.

Be polite and courteous.

Allow others to learn.

Accept and celebrate the differences within the academy community. Hold doors open for fellow students, staff and visitors.

Be Safe

Do not enter classrooms/laboratories until given permission from a member of staff.

Use equipment safely, particularly when in laboratories, using specialist equipment in Design and Technology and during PE lessons.

Always act in a way that will not cause danger to others.

Never verbally or physically abuse someone else.

Do not bring any illegal, offensive, dangerous or forbidden items into school. Do not enter unauthorised areas of the school, particularly during break and lunchtimes.

Movement around school must be calm and orderly.

For poor behaviour our school implements a variety of appropriate sanctions that include varying levels of detentions both during the school day and after school, time in the refection room and rarely, exclusions. We will work closely with parents of students who are struggling to follow our expectations.

Mobile Telephones

Students may bring mobile phones into school, but the school will not take responsibility for loss or damage.

Students must not bring any other electronic devices into school such as tablets or smart watches.

Mobiles must be kept securely in bags or lockers and switched off during the school day. They are there for use to and from school and should not be seen at any other point. Where this is not observed, students will have their phone confiscated. It will be placed into a sealable bag and placed into a lockable unit. Students will be issued with a receipt from the sealable bag and students can collect it at the end of the day. On the third and subsequent confiscations within the school year, the mobile phone will need to be collected by the parent/ carer.
