The Induction Process

Once decisions regarding admission to Chase Terrace have been made we work closely with the Primary schools to gain as much information regarding the students so that our Pastoral Support Team can meet any specific needs students may have. We also offer further opportunities for students to meet with staff through our Induction days, and additional visits, that run in June and July.

Parents are also part of the process and evenings are set on the calendar for meeting with Pastoral Staff and the Leadership Team to receive more formal information regarding the school and its processes and expectation and for parents to be able address any outstanding concerns regarding Learning or pastoral issues. How do we calculate minimum expectations?

- Use KS2 test scores as a starting point
- Although progress is measured nationally based on KS2 assessments, this does not always tell the full story
- We therefore use other indicators to highlight what students are confident with from primary school
- Students sit CATs tests and GL assessments for this reason
- They also sit some internal maths and English tests during the course of the year

Reporting

- You will receive two progress reports home each academic year.
- For Year 7, the first report will be issued w/b 23rd Jan. Grades and written comments focussed on progress
- The second report will be issued on Friday 21st July. This will provide an end-of-year data summary
