

Curriculum Overview – German

Our lessons are delivered employing the expert subject knowledge of experienced teachers who have a passion for languages. Through the teaching of different topics, we engage in regular, spaced recycling and retrieval of high frequency vocabulary and grammar across the four key skill areas (listening, speaking, reading and writing), as well as interleaving in order to embed the learning in the long-term memory. Formal and informal assessments are used to inform future learning in subsequent topics, allowing teachers to focus on areas of knowledge and understanding which may need more practice.
